Priorities for 2017/18

Our objectives:

- To provide social and emotional support for disadvantaged groups and their families to ensure that children are in the best position to learn.
- To provide an enriched curriculum which provides rich life experiences and encourages use of language.
- To increase the number of pupils in receipt of the pupil premium grant meeting and exceeding their age related expectations in Writing and Maths.

We aim to meet these objectives by using our PPG for the following:

Staff training on planning and delivering interventions in Maths (White Rose)

LA and parent workshops on calculation strategies

Maths equipment to support concrete/abstract teaching approaches

LA support in all Maths lessons

LA support in all English lessons

Monitoring/evaluation of writing across the curriculum

Focus groups led by teacher and LA to ensure ALL children have the opportunity to participate in small group support sessions for Writing and Maths.

Attainment data and on-going gap analysis using pupil progress prediction grids and PIRA/PUMA data will be used to drive planning so that next steps in learning needs are identified early and addressed to ensure progress over time is accelerated and the gap is closed.

All teaching to be good to outstanding to ensure effective learning in all classrooms. Learning assistants will be expected to support small groups in all English and Maths lessons.

There have been a number of PP children who have been identified as also being vulnerable. This can affect attitudes to learning and hinder progress. To address this, Pupil premium funding will be used to enable staff to refer children for Listening Ear and school counselling sessions.

More able Pupil Premium children across all year groups will be tracked and targeted with support to ensure they make accelerated progress.

Throughout the school, monitoring and tracking will be used to ensure Pupil Premium children achieve age-related expectations in Maths.

In-school provision will be provided for homework activities. Twice weekly lunchtime sessions to be offered to children who require resources/adult-led support.
